# Report | First meeting of the GTPF working group on formats, methods and context

On 12 January 2024, a group of 15 people met to initiate the working group 'formats, methods and context' within the Society for Transdisciplinary and Participatory Research (GTPF). The kick-off online meeting was used to get to know each other and agree on expectations and goals. The organization of work in 2024 is primarily planned online in three to four meetings. In addition, contentrelated inputs will be provided at the GTPF General Assembly and at the ITD and PartWiss conferences, in conjunction with the results of the work in the tdAcademy. Bettina Brohmann, Melanie Mbah, and Regina Rhodius will act as interim managers until the next meeting of the working group in April. # Report | GTPF working group on impact is launched

Transdisciplinary research is characterized by the fact that both social and scientific effects should be achieved. The "Impact" working group aims to further develop impact research and assessment by strengthening the exchange within this area. The group was established at the annual assembly of the Society for Transdisciplinary and Participatory Research (GTPF) on 22.11.2023 in Chemnitz on the initiative of the ZTG and ISOE and will be officially established by the GTPF Board in March. The group's first working meeting took place on January 29, 2024 with 36 participants from a wide range of disciplines and institutions involved in participatory, transdisciplinary and citizen science. The participants agreed on key topics that will be worked on in three subgroups: "Indicators
